
## RECHARGEABLE BATTERY SAFETY TIPS

## HANDLE WITH CARE



BE GENTLE!

Never throw a battery, tamper with it, or try to break it open.

2 CHECK FOR DAMAGE.
Stop using a battery if it is rusted, smoking, leaking, or has changed color/shape.


3 STORE IN A SAFE PLACE.

Keep out of reach of little kids! If anyone swallows a battery, call 1-800-498-8666 for help.


4 STAY COOL (BUT NOT COLD!)

Don't leave batteries out in the sun, a hot car, or icy weather.











LET IT BREATHE!

Charging under a pillow, tucked into the couch, or between blankets is a fire hazard.

SAFETY FIRST



**NEVER MIX & MATCH.** 

Only use chargers that are meant for your device. Replace batteries all at once!





1 DON'T THROW THEM OUT.

Rechargeable batteries aren't trash!
They should always be recycled.

TURN IN AT A STORE.

You can turn in old batteries at most hardware stores (Lowe's, Home Depot).
